A Year in Review

2017 has been quite the year for the City of Marietta Fire Department.

In 2017, Marietta Fire Department incorporated several new processes. We successfully transitioned into digital building and systems plan submission and plan review, a completely paperless system. We commissioned a new program called Community Risk Reduction. This program allowed us to obtain and distribute smoke alarms, carbon monoxide alarms, and a fire safety message to the citizens of Marietta. With support of the community, local businesses can now be more prepared in the event of a disaster thanks to the implementation of another branch of our Community Risk Reduction program focusing on businesses.

As noted on the statistical summary, Marietta Fire Department responded to 12,971 calls for service. Behind each one of those numbers is a face, a family, and a loved one. Our Department is committed to serving its citizens and visitors by providing the best possible care whenever called upon. With pride and ownership, our response crews serve this community with an unwavering commitment to provide exceptional emergency services.

The Training Division worked to provide a training platform that assists our firefighters in staying abreast of the latest best practices and techniques. Marietta Fire Department welcomed nine recruits to its ranks, after having been subjected to 12 weeks of rigorous training in the areas of fire suppression, hazardous materials response, and are now working toward becoming licensed Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians.
