General Election Information

2022 - 2026

The next election for Mayor and Council will be November 2, 2021 and will take office on January 1, 2022 (1st Monday) for a four-year term, ending January 2026 (1st Monday).

OFFICES (nonpartisan races):

- Mayor (elected city-wide)
- Seven (7) Council seats (elected by Ward)
- Seven (7) Education Board seats (elected by Ward)

QUALIFICATIONS:

Mayor:

To be eligible for the office of Mayor:

- Shall be at least 21 years of age.
- Shall meet the requirements of a qualified voter of the city, as prescribed by state law.
- Shall not be ineligible for public office pursuant to code section 45-2-1 of the O.C.G.A. The residency requirement for a candidate for Mayor shall be 12 months residency within the municipality.
- Shall not be eligible who has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude unless such person's civil rights have been restored.
- Shall continue to reside within the city limits for which elected during term of office.

Council:

To be eligible for the office of Council:

- Shall be at least 21 years of age.
- Shall meet the requirements of a qualified voter of the city, as prescribed by state law.
- Shall not be ineligible for public office pursuant to code section 45-2-1 of the O.C.G.A.
- Shall be a bona fide resident of the ward from which he seeks election for the same period of time required by code section 45-2-1 of the O.C.G.A. for residency of municipal officers within the city, which is 12 months residency.
- Shall not be eligible who have been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude unless such person's civil rights have been restored.
- Shall continue to reside within the city ward for which elected during term of office.

Board of Education:

To be eligible for the office of Board of Education a person:

- Has to be a citizen of the United States;
- Has to be at least 21 years of age;
- Has to be registered to vote as prescribed by state law; and
- Has to meet the residency requirements set forth in the Marietta City Code Section 2.202(e), which reads:

“The residency requirements for a person seeking to be elected to the board of education shall be:
(1) In the case of a general election, the person shall be a resident of the ward for which the office is sought on or before July 1 next preceding the date of taking of office and, in addition, the person shall be a resident of the City of Marietta on or before January 1 next preceding the date of taking office; and

(2) In the case of a special election, the person shall be a resident of the ward for which the office is sought for a minimum of six (6) months next preceding the date of taking of office and, in addition, the person shall be a resident of the City of Marietta for a minimum of 12 months next preceding the date of taking of office; provided, however, that the residency requirements for 1993 shall be the lessor of the requirements set forth in this paragraph or the effective date of this law pursuant to Section 5 of the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1973 (C).”

COMPENSATION for the mayor and councilmembers.

The Mayor is compensated at \$25,200 per year, \$2,100 per month, plus \$160 expenses (Ord. #7918, Approved 8/10/2016, Effective 1/1/2018).

The 7 Council members are compensated at \$18,900 per year, \$1,575 per month, plus \$150 expenses (Ord. #7918, Approved 8/10/2016, Effective 1/1/2018).

Regular City Council meetings are held the second Wednesday of every month, at 7 p.m. in the Council Chamber located on the first floor of Marietta City Hall, 205 Lawrence St.

City Council committee meetings are usually held the last Wednesday of every month, at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chamber located on the first floor of Marietta City Hall, 205 Lawrence St.

The Agenda Work Sessions are held the Monday prior to the Regular Council meeting, at 5:15 p.m. in the Council Chamber located on the first floor of Marietta City Hall, 205 Lawrence St.

FILING SCHEDULE FOR ELECTION YEAR

If you plan to accept/expend a combined total of contributions or expenditures exceeding \$2,500, the filing dates are below:

September 30, 2021, October 25, 2021 and December 31, 2021

If you do not plan to accept/expend a combined total of contributions or expenditures exceeding \$2,500, you are eligible to file the Affidavit of a Candidate's Intent not to exceed \$2,500 in Contributions. (See enclosed document)

A Personal Financial Disclosure Statement covering the period of the preceding calendar year shall be filed no later than the **fifteenth day** following the date of qualifying as a candidate. Only one Financial Disclosure Statement is required per calendar year.

CAMPAIGN SIGNS - Temporary political campaign signage (including posters and advertisements) limited to 32 square feet per sign area and there shall be no more than 2 sign faces per road frontage. Any political signage that does not meet these requirements shall be required to obtain a sign permit and follow those restrictions set forth for that type of sign. All signs must be removed within 5 days of the last day that the candidate's name or that issue appears on a ballot for a primary, runoff, general or special election. All such signs are prohibited

(a) within any public right-of-way, (b) on any public property or building, (c) on any private property unless the owner thereof has given permission (Marietta City Code 714.03E).

It shall be unlawful for any person to place campaign posters, signs, and advertisements on any property zoned for commercial or industrial uses if the placement of such campaign posters, signs, and advertisements conflicts with any zoning laws or ordinances (O.C.G.A. 21-2-3(5)).
