## **Strategic Response**

- Increased patrols of hotels and properties on Delk/Franklin Road (Zone 1)
- Increase foot patrols throughout zone (Zone 1)
- Investigations into gang activity (Zone 1)
- Increase patrols on Roswell Road and surrounding streets (Zone 2)
- Increase patrols in neighborhoods off Barnes Mill (Zone 2)
- Continue Processing all Theft from Autos (Zone 2)
- Increase patrols and Criminal Trespass Enforcement along the South Loop Corridor (Zone 3)
- Burglary and Zone patrols around neighborhoods (Zone 3)
- Continue heavy uniform patrols in residential areas with emphasis on apartment complexes (Zone 4)
- Conduct heavy patrols along all areas of Cunningham Road, Bellemead Drive and Booth Road (Zone 4)
- Increased shift presence and heavy zone patrols including daytime burglary patrols (Zone 4)

## **Specialized Units – Detectives/Narcotics/Crime Interdiction**

Specialized units within Marietta Police Department contribute to the success of each zone. It is the responsibility of each unit supervisor to have teams work within zones that may have increased activity over the previous months.

- Five narcotics cases were opened within the City of Marietta
- Five arrests were made within the City for drug offenses by Narcotics Unit
- Detectives opened 69 cases, served 10 search warrants, and worked several cases including but not limited to:
  - Aggravated Assault
  - Aggravated Battery
  - Burglary
  - Robbery
  - Sexual Battery/Child Molestation

- Computer Pornography
- Computer Exploitation of a Child
- Theft
- Stalking
- Terroristic Threats
- Drugs
- Crime Interdiction Unit made 14 arrests.
