Strategic Response

- Continue extra duty patrols of hotels and properties on Delk/Franklin Road.
- Increasing foot patrols throughout the city during Morning Watch hours.
- CIU's continued investigations of gang activity.
- Crime Free Housing Training & CPTEDS of apartment complexes.
- Analysis of Z2 YTD – Increase in MVT almost 1/3 of MVT from Z2 in 2017 have been at 1955 Bells Ferry Rd (Laurel Hills Preserve)
- Revisit Bait Vehicles
- Analysis of Z2 YTD – Increase in Robberies YTD 14 in 2017 – increase of 9 5 on Roswell Rd / 3 @ 1805 Roswell Rd
- Continue HEAVY uniform patrols in apartment complexes.
- Conduct heavy patrols on Powder Spring Road and Booth Road subdivisions
- Increased shift presence when manpower allows, 3 zone cars.
- Heavy zone patrols by day shift/CRU in areas identified.

Specialized Units – Detectives/Narcotics/Crime Interdiction

Specialized units within Marietta Police Department contribute to the success of each zone. It is the responsibility of each unit supervisor to have teams work within zones that may have increased activity over the previous months.

- Six narcotics cases were opened within the City of Marietta
- Four arrests were made within the City for drug offenses by Narcotics Unit
- Detectives opened 74 cases, served 8 search warrants, and worked several cases including but not limited to:
 - Theft by Taking
 - Child Pornography
 - Enticing Child Sexual (Chat Case)
 - Aggravated Stalking
 - Motor Vehicle Theft

- Crime Interdiction Unit made 10 arrests.
