## **Strategic Response**

- Increased patrols of hotels and properties, and specialized patrols on Delk/Franklin Road (Zone 1)
- Increased foot patrols to help deter shoplifting (Zone 1)
- Continue Crime Free Housing program (Zone 1)
- Increase Criminal Trespass agreements (Zone 1)
- Increase patrols of Bells Ferry and Williams Drive area; as well as Roswell Road, Lower Roswell Road and Powers Ferry areas (Zone 2)
- Enforcing Apartment Crime Ordinance (Zone 2)
- Continue foot patrols at businesses to deter shoplifting (Zone 3)
- Increase patrols and Criminal Trespass Enforcement along the South Loop Corridor (Zone 3)
- Burglary and Zone Patrols around neighborhoods and Square (Zone 3)
- Continue heavy uniform patrols in residential areas with emphasis on apartment complexes (Zone 4)
- Conduct heavy patrols along all areas of Cunningham Road, Bellemeade Drive and Booth Road (Zone 4)
- Increased shift presence and heavy zone patrols (Zone 4)

## **Specialized Units – Detectives/Narcotics/Crime Interdiction**

Specialized units within Marietta Police Department contribute to the success of each zone. It is the responsibility of each unit supervisor to have teams work within zones that may have increased activity over the previous months.

- Four narcotics cases opened within the City of Marietta
- Three arrests were made within the City for drug offenses by Narcotics Unit
- Detectives opened 63 cases, served 14 search warrants, and worked several cases including but not limited to:
  - Felony Murder
  - Rape
  - Aggravated Assault

- Burglary
  - Possession of Firearm by Felon
  - Possession of Firearm during Felony
  - Theft by Deceiving
  - Theft by Taking
  - Theft by Receiving
  - Computer Theft
  - Entering Autos
  - Obstruction
  - Drugs
- Crime Interdiction Unit made sixteen arrests.
