### **Community Interaction**

### **Strategic Response**

- Sign criminal trespass agreements with the hotels in the Delk Road area (Zone 1)
- Increased patrols of hotels and properties, and specialized patrols on Delk/Franklin Road (Zone 1)

- Increase patrols to help deter shoplifting (Zone 1)
- Increase zone patrols in areas to deter auto thefts (Zone 2)
- Increase Neighborhood/Saturation Patrols (Zone 3)
- Focus on vagrant camps and graffiti removal (Zone 3)
- Increase patrols to help deter shoplifting (Zone 3)
- Continue heavy uniform patrols in residential areas with emphasis on apartment complexes (Zone 4)
- Conduct heavy patrols along all areas of Powder Springs Road and Booth Road
- Saturation patrols – Strategic Enforcement Plan (Zone 4)
- Increased shift presence (Zone 4)

### **Specialized Units – Detectives/Narcotics/Crime Interdiction**

Specialized units within Marietta Police Department contribute to the success of each zone. It is the responsibility of each unit supervisor to have teams work within zones that may have increased activity over the previous months.

- Three narcotics cases opened within the City of Marietta
- Four arrests were made within the City for drug offenses by Narcotics Unit
- Detectives opened seventy cases, served three search warrants, and worked several cases including but not limited to:
  - Rape
  - Aggravated Sexual Battery
  - Aggravated Child Molestation
  - Burglary
  - Theft by Receiving
  - Entering Auto
  - Obstruction
- Crime Interdiction Unit made twenty-five arrests.
