Specialized Units – Detectives/Narcotics/Crime Interdiction

Specialized units within Marietta Police Department contribute to the success of each zone. It is the responsibility of each unit supervisor to have teams work within zones that may have increased activity over the previous months.

- Thirteen narcotics cases opened within the City of Marietta
- Five arrests were made within the City for drug offenses by Narcotics Unit
- Detectives opened sixty-two cases, served seventeen search warrants, and worked several cases including but not limited to:
 - Prostitution
 - Rape, Aggravated Child Molestation
 - Theft by Receiving
 - Burglary
 - Aggravated Assault
 - Felony Murder
 - Theft by Taking
 - Deprivation of a Minor
 - Battery
 - Exploitation of Child

- Crime Interdiction Unit made forty-two arrests.
